Additionally there was a borough meeting announcing the results of the forensic evaluation where the Mayor stated that ALL residents who were effected would be notified and there would be an enhanced contract to protect residents moving forward. I called you after that meeting to ask if Atlantic could come in to present our ransomware protection services overview where you notified me that the borough does not have to take bids on those contracts (believe not mandated thus not entertained). I would like the minutes/notes documents for that meeting.

The RPD breach occurred on or about September 7, 2021.

There were seven Ramsey residents who received notification letters (form of letter attached). Any residents receiving a notification letter had a call line set up for their use and the opportunity to elect identity monitoring, credit monitoring and other protections, including identity fraud reimbursement. No calls were ever made to the call service and no one activated the protections offered.
